SOME THOUGHTS FOR PRAYER *Transfiguration*

From my college days, I can still remember my lecturer's vivid demonstration of the Transfiguration. He stood at the front of the class, pulled his jacket closely around him and then suddenly "flashed" it open to reveal a bright shirt underneath. (It was all quite proper!) He then quietly closed his jacket again. As the disciples gazed at Jesus on the Mount, it was as if the outer ordinary layer of his humanity was suddenly drawn back to reveal the true glory of God. Or perhaps it was the veil over the eyes of the disciples that was revealed or both. It was a moment of revelation to the disciples and to Jesus. We undergo a similar process of revelation in our own lives.

The Spirit of God is always at work within us, transforming the dross and whatever conceals our true glory as human beings made in the image of God and gradually bringing about our divinization.

In our lives, God wastes nothing of our experiences. Even things we regret doing, or the harm that might have been done to us by others can be "transfigured" and woven into the renewed fabric of our being. We are not held enslaved to our past, but, through God's grace, we are liberated to walk tall and strong and with compassion for others and enriched by our lived experiences. *WRM*
